CONSULTANCY SERVICES

Many of the Departments and Units such as Instrumentation Centre, Library etc, of our College are extending their expertise to the society including other Educational Institutions, General Public, NGOs, Industries in the form of Consultancy services by collecting nominal charges from the users. Accordingly a sum of **Rs. 23,34,485.00** has been collected from various users as Consultancy Charges (**Vide Annexure**)

INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE

The Instrumentation Centre of our College, established in the year 2005 using grants from DST-FIST and UGC-CPE/CE, has been equipped with sophisticated instruments like UV-visible spectrophotometer, Fourier Transform Infrared Spectrophotometer, High-Performance Liquid Chromatography, Atomic Absorption Spectrometer, Gas Chromatography-Mass Spectrometry, Particle Size Analyzer and SpectroFluorophotometer. This centre caters to the needs of the researchers of our college as well as other colleges, universities, research institutions and industries as a Consultancy Service, at affordable charges. In the year under review, nearly 4279 samples were analyzed using the instruments mentioned above. The centre has earned a sum of Rs. **8,71,695/-** by analyzing the samples received from 62 colleges, 14 universities and 10 industries.

A separate room with a Large Display TV with Internet connectivity is also available to watch online Educational Programmes. Among the Post-graduate Departments, Botany, Tamil, Computer Science and Economics have produced **100% results**. Departments of Zoology, M.C.A., Microbiology, Biotechnology and English have produced more than **90% results**.

UGC-SPONSORED COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHEME

The University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, has given approval for offering **16** Diploma Courses under the scheme of UGC – Community College. Our College is one of the few Colleges in Tamil Nadu to offer such programmes for the benefit of the rural students. These courses are designed in such a way that the students in these programmes acquire the skills required for entrepreneurship.

HOSTELS

Four halls of residence viz., Graham Hall, Vairam and Bose Halls and JanakiAmmal Hall are available on campus to provide homely accommodation to our students. They are the second homes for the inmates. The inmates are provided with a healthy diet and motherly care. The average mess rate per day per head works out to be Rs.90 and Rs.82 during the academic year 2022-2023 for Boys and Girls Hostels respectively.
